#lu can be unpleasant, but if you are other\$ise healthy it \$ill usually clear up on its o\$n \$ithin 2:/ \$eeks.

Ho\$ever, flu can be more severe in certain people, such as6

- ? anyone aged 31 and over
- ? pregnant \$omen
- ? children and adults \$ith an underlying health condition ,particularly long:term heart or respiratory disease-
 - ? children and adults \$ith \$eakened immune systems
 - ? health and social care staff directly involved in patient care

7nyone in these risk groups is more likely to develop potentially serious complications of flu, such as pneumonia, a lung infection-, so it it recommended that they have a flu vaccine every year to protect them.

5ery fe\$ people are unable to have the flu lab, but you should avoid it if you have had a serious allergic reaction to the flu lab in the past.

People \$ho have egg allergy may be at increased risk of reaction to the inlectable flu vaccine because some flu labs are made using eggs.

In recent years, flu labs that are egg:free have become available. 7n egg:free flu vaccine isnit available from Occupational Health but your (P may be able to find a suitable flu vaccine \$ith a lo\$ egg content. >epending on the severity of your egg allergy, your (P may need to refer you to a specialist to have the vaccination in hospital.

If you are ill \$ith a fever, it best to delay your flu vaccination until you have recovered. . here is no need to delay your flu ab if you have a minor illness \$ith no fever such as a cold.

It is fine to have the flu lab \$hile you are taking antibiotics.

Protection after having the vaccine is usually achieved 2 days after having the vaccine.

Aerious side effects of the inlected flu vaccine are very rare. <ou may have a slight temperature and aching muscles for a couple of days after having the lab, and your arm may be a bit sore \$here you \$ere inlected.

<ou cannot catch flu from the vaccine.
